

HEALTH ALERT — Street Fentanyl

Killing San Joaquin County Residents

There is no such thing as a safe street drug. Know the risks.



Fentanyl is often **ADDED** to other illegal drugs without people knowing.

Fentanyl has been found in:

- Heroin
- Meth
- Fake pills—Oxycodone, Norco, Xanax
- Cocaine

50-100 times

more potent than

Heroin • Oxycodone • Morphine

Fen•tanyl

Prescription opioid narcotic, intended for cancer patients in severe pain

Can be absorbed through the skin

You can't see it, smell it, or taste it.

Warning signs of Fentanyl Overdose



- **Discolored skin:** blueish-purple for light-skin people; greyish for darker-skin people
- **Snoring, gasping, or gurgling sounds** – known as “death rattle”
- **Extreme muscle rigidity, to point of seizures**
- **Foaming at the mouth**
- **Blood from nose and mouth**
- **Weak, barely-detectable pulse**



If You Use Substances:



Have Naloxone

Overdose happens fast. Make sure you and your friends carry Naloxone / Narcan.



Don't use alone

Make sure someone is around, to give Naloxone / Narcan if you overdose.



Call 911

Think it is an overdose? **CALL 911.** Be anonymous or stay and offer support.
